Assessment:

Activity during Classes:

Students can earn up to 15 points through participation in class activities. This involves answering two exam questions during the last small group session each week. Points are awarded based on demonstrated knowledge (0-1 point).

Final Tests per Module:

Students can earn up to 25 points through module-specific final tests. The exact scoring is based on an attached table.

Final Examination and Skills Assessment:

Students can earn up to 60 points through the final examination and skills assessment. The skills assessment involves evaluating a patient with a mental disorder, including a psychiatric interview, medical history, mental status, summaries, differential-diagnostic considerations, additional examinations, and a treatment plan (up to 15 points). The final examination consists of answering three questions, which students draw from predefined question groups (up to 15 points per question). To pass the exam, students must earn more than 50% of the points in the skills assessment.
